Careers and employability are at the heart of the work within Scarborough UTC. Our core values are technical excellence and employable graduates. Within our core values we have four areas of foci that permeate all of our lessons:

Self-Management Understanding Teamwork Creativity

Our curriculum is developed in partnership with local and national employers so you get a mix of academic and technical learning. These are delivered in world class facilities by engineering and computer science experts. Students learn both practical and academic skills to prepare them for the world of work. These have a key focus on engineering and computer science.

Students in the UTC have access to a minimum of one week of work experience during Year 10 and Year 12. There are also numerous employer engagement opportunities through our sponsors who lead lesson sessions, workshops, competitions and mentoring for students. During COVID 19 Pandemic we have followed guidance from NYBEP and not participated in live work experience but offered virtual placements with GCHQ and Airbus. We aim to offer in person placements for students in Year 10 and 12 in June 2021.
